Dear Mercedes Consolidation Center Supplier:

Effective Monday, February 18, 2019, the Mercedes Consolidation Center (CC) will begin enforcing chargebacks to all suppliers (including, but not limited to, KON, JIS, Body, and Assembly) for any deviation in the Daimler/MBUSI shipping and labeling standards established between MBUSI and our suppliers. These chargebacks will be in alignment with those laid out and previously communicated to our supply base in October 2018. This is in an effort to mitigate the negative effects that these deviations cause in our process.

In order to eliminate these risks, we are requiring all of our suppliers validate that shipments adhere to the Daimler/MBUSI shipping and labeling standards. Please reinforce within your organization the following guidelines:

- ASN to be sent to Mercedes CC at the time the shipment is sent with the correct trailer number included; shipment to be against valid schedule agreement/item/unload point: only one shipment against one Handling Unit.
- Shipments must adhere to Mercedes packaging and labeling specifications in the Supplier Communication Guide on the Daimler Portal.

Please review your shipping process and ensure that the above mentioned standards are met. Mercedes CC will charge back \$1,000 for each deviation to the ASN standard. For further details on the chargeback layout for label and packaging errors, please refer to the attached letter dated October 10, 2018.

Dear MBUSI Supplier:

There are multiple shipments arriving each day at our Logistics Center that do not meet the established standards between MBUSI and our suppliers. These abnormalities create inefficiencies in our internal processes that put our production at risk. Any deviation to our standards will result in a chargeback.

In order to eliminate this risk we are requiring that all of our suppliers validate that shipments adhere to the Daimler/MBUSI shipping and labeling standards. Please reinforce within your organization the following guidelines:

- ASN to be sent to MBUSI at the time the shipment is sent with the correct trailer number included; shipment to be against valid schedule agreement/item/unload point: only one shipment against one Handling Unit.
- Shipments must adhere to MBUSI packaging & labeling specifications in the Supplier Communication Guide on the Daimler Portal.

Please review your shipping processes and ensure that the above mentioned standards are met. MBUSI will charge back \$1,000 for each deviation to the ASN standard. For label and packaging errors please refer to the debits and penalties attached to this letter. Along with the chargebacks for a shipment error, MBUSI will also issue a chargeback for any missing parts on vehicles or downtime caused by an ASN, label or packaging error.

Label and Packaging Debits and Penalties

Suppliers will receive debits against receiveables for non-conformities. For parts shipping in unapproved corrugated or unapproved alternate packaging – without written approval from the respective MBUSI Packaging Engineer/Specialist. Reference Document SCGPA11 form when requesting by part number the use of alternate packaging. Blanket authorization will only be approved under ver strict and specific circumstances.

All MBUSI packaging & labeling specifications are documented and can be found in the Supplier Communication Guide on the Daimler Portal.

Shipment to MBUSI of previously "Repair Request" tagged racks or	\$500 per incident

Non-submittal of packaging fleet purchase documentation – due two	\$500 per month
weeks after each SOP, volume increase, etc. Documentation to include	
packaging manufacturer, packaging/dunnage cost, quantity ordered

Non-submittal of final drawings for racks, dunnage, trays, etc.	\$500 per month per drawing
Failure to submit Acknowledgement Sheet (October 1, 2017 forward)	\$500 per quarter
